

What if you don't get the guaranteed score?

If you achieve the University Entrance Standard but do not achieve a rank score that will guarantee selection into the programme you wish to study, your application will be given individual consideration if places are available in that programme.

Selection may take into account the following factors according to the programme you are applying for:

- Your performance in relevant subjects
- Eligibility for a targeted admission scheme
- Results of an interview where deemed appropriate to determine your potential for success in the programme

If you are successful in gaining a place, you may have conditions placed on your enrolment.

Targeted Admission Schemes

At The University of Auckland we have a range of admission schemes to improve access into higher education for equity groups. If you are a Māori or Pacific student, or a student with a disability, and have not met the guaranteed score, you may be eligible for inclusion in a targeted admission scheme. Admission may be subject to conditions.

What if you don't get in?

If you are not offered a place in your programme, we have a range of alternative pathways that are designed to bridge the gap between your secondary school studies and university.

The University of Auckland Tertiary Foundation Certificate

A one-year preliminary programme in Arts and Science that will prepare you for tertiary-level study. Successful completion will qualify you to apply for admission into undergraduate level programmes.
NB: Some undergraduate qualifications have higher entry requirements than others.

Hikitia Te Ora – Certificate in Health Sciences

A one-year programme designed to prepare students of Māori and Pacific descent for tertiary study in the health professions. Successful completion enables you to apply for admission to the University's healthcare programmes including Health Sciences, Nursing, Pharmacy, or other health-related programmes offered by allied tertiary institutions. Successful completion also prepares applicants for the entry routes into Medicine.

Foundation Certificate Education

A one-year programme specifically designed to prepare you for study in teacher education or social services. The programme focuses on developing your learning and study skills and introduces you to the tertiary study environment.

Foundation Certificate Tohu Tūāpapa Mātauranga

A one-year programme for students who wish to develop their te reo Māori and tikanga Māori proficiency and knowledge while gaining essential skills for future tertiary study in Education.

School leaver admission requirements

All undergraduate programmes have a limit on the number of places available. We expect to enrol approximately the same number of students in 2012 as we have in recent years.

All undergraduate applicants applying based on NCEA, CIE or IB will be given a rank score. If you meet the University Entrance Standard, the rank score and the other requirements for your programme or programmes, you will be offered a place.

The guaranteed entry score for each programme is set on past enrolments and the academic performance of applicants. Some programmes select largely on the basis of auditions and portfolios. Applicants need to be aware of the subject requirements and other requirements for their chosen programme.

The guaranteed entry scores for admission to The University of Auckland in 2012 are printed in this brochure.

Please note that the table of undergraduate admission requirements printed in the 2012 *Undergraduate Prospectus* contains the rank scores

that guaranteed admission in 2011. Some of the guaranteed entry scores for 2012 have changed. All other information in the prospectus relates to 2012 admission.

Applicants for the Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (MBChB) must first complete Year 1 of either the BHSc or the BSc in Biomedical Science, or have completed another degree approved by the Faculty of Medical and Health Sciences.

Applicants for the Bachelor of Optometry (BOptom) must first complete the set courses from the common year of the BSc in Biomedical Science (or equivalent) or have completed another degree approved by the Faculty of Science.

International students will be required to achieve higher rank scores.

1. Māori school leaver applicants who achieve the University Entrance (UE) Standard will be admitted to the Bachelor of Arts (BA) through the Targeted Admission Scheme.
2. Māori and Pacific school leaver applicants who achieve the UE Standard and meet other requirements will be admitted to the programmes in the Faculty of Education through the Targeted Admission Scheme.
3. Māori and Pacific school leaver applicants who achieve the UE Standard will be admitted to the Bachelor of Science (BSc) through the Targeted Admission Scheme. Higher admission standards are required for the majors in Biomedical Science and Sport and Exercise Science.
4. Māori and Pacific school leaver applicants who achieve the UE Standard will be admitted to the Bachelor of Theology (BTheol) through the Targeted Admission Scheme.
